## NCLB Accountability Requirements

#### What is Required by NCLB to be included in AYP?

- State reading assessments for all students
- State mathematics assessments for all students
- State assessment participation rates
- One additional Other Measure
- Seven Student Groups
- Performance at 100% by 2014
- Federal cap on proficient results from alternate assessments

### Texas AYP Criteria

#### INDICATORS

- Districts/campuses are evaluated on three indicators for AYP:
  - Reading/English Language Arts (ELA),
  - Mathematics,
  - Other Measure.
- Missing AYP on the same indicator two years in a row triggers Title I School Improvement Requirements

#### COMPONENTS


- Reading/ELA and Mathematics indicators are evaluated on two components:
  - Performance
  - Participation
- A campus must meet AYP on both components of the Reading/ELA and mathematics indicators to meet AYP.
- Other Measure (Graduation, Attendance)

- Seven student groups are evaluated for both Performance and Participation on Reading/ELA and Mathematics:
  - 1. All students
  - 2. African American students
  - 3. Hispanic students
  - 4. White students
  - **5.** Economically disadvantaged students
  - 6. Special education students
  - **7.** Limited English proficient students

#### **2008 STANDARDS**

- Reading/English Language Arts
  - Performance: 60% Proficiency Rate
  - Participation: 95% Rate
- Mathematics
  - Performance: 50% Proficiency Rate
  - Participation: 95% Rate
- Other Measure
  - Secondary: 70% Graduation Rate
  - Elementary/Middle/Junior High schools: 90% Attendance Rate

#### Performance at 100% by 2014



AYP Performance Targets: 2002-03 to 2013-14

#### Alternative to Meeting the Standard

- Reading/ELA
  - Performance: 10% decrease in percent not passing plus any improvement on Other Indicator
  - Participation: Two-year average rate of 95%
  - Mathematics
    - Performance: 10% decrease in percent not passing plus any improvement on Other Indicator
    - Participation : Two-year average rate of 95%

#### Alternative to Meeting the Standard (cont.)

- Other Measure
  - Secondary: Increase in Graduation Rate from previous year.
  - Elementary/Middle/Junior High schools: Increase in Attendance Rate from previous year

- Federal Cap on Proficient Results on Alternate Assessments
  - Proficient Results for Students with Disabilities Assessed on Alternate Assessments are subject to Federal 3% cap:
    - TAKS-Modified: 2% cap on proficient results
    - TAKS-Alternate: 1% cap on proficient results

## Student Groups Evaluated

#### State Accountability

 All Students, African American, Hispanic, White, Economically Disadvantaged

#### Federal Accountability

 All Students, African American, Hispanic, White, Economically Disadvantaged, Special Education, and Limited English Proficient (LEP)

### Subject Areas Evaluated

- State Accountability
  - Reading/ELA, Mathematics, Writing, Science, and Social Studies

- Federal Accountability
  - Reading/ELA and Mathematics
  - Science assessments are federally required but not currently used for AYP

### Assessments Evaluated in 2008

#### State Accountability

- TAKS (English and Spanish) Five Subject Areas
- TAKS (Accommodated) Selected Grades/Subjects
- Federal Accountability Reading/ELA and Mathematics only
  - TAKS (English and Spanish)
  - TAKS (Accommodated)
  - TAKS Linguistically Accommodated Tests
  - TAKS-Modified (subject to 2% cap on proficient results)
  - TAKS-Alternate (subject to 1% cap on proficient results)

  - Academically Unacceptable
  - Academically Acceptable
  - Recognized
  - Exemplary
  - Federal Accountability
    - Missed AYP
    - Meets AYP

## "Hurdles" Required in 2008

#### State Accountability

- 25 Assessment Measures
- 10 Completion/Dropout Measures
- 35 Total Measures (if all minimum size requirements are met)
- **Federal Accountability** 
  - 14 Assessment Measures Performance
  - 14 Assessment Measures Participation
  - 1 Other Measure (Graduation/Attendance)
  - 29 Total Measures (if all minimum size requirements are met)

### **Participation Requirements**

#### State Accountability

Performance-Based Monitoring System identifies and intervenes with districts that have excessive counts of students not tested.

- Federal Accountability
  - Districts/Campuses must meet 95% participation criteria.

### Non-Assessment Indicators

- State Accountability
  - Annual Dropout Rate (Grades 7-8)
  - Completion Rate I

- Federal Accountability
  - Graduation Rate
  - Attendance Rate

## Alternative Education Campuses

- State Accountability
  - Alternative Education Accountability (AEA) procedures for:
    - Residential Facilities
    - Alternative Education Campuses (AECs) (operated by school districts and charters for students at risk)
- Federal Accountability
  - AYP applies same procedures to both regular campuses and Residential Facilities and AECs.
  - Districts with Residential Facilities may qualify for increase in the 1% cap on TAKS-Alt proficient results.

## Accountability Development Process

#### State Accountability

- Annual Review by Educator Focus Group and Commissioner's Accountability Advisory Committee (CAAC)
- New Assessments Phased-in With "Report, Report, Use" timeline
- Federal Accountability
  - USDE approval required annually for AYP workbook
  - Limited opportunity for input or feedback by local educators in implementing new provisions
  - New requirements implemented immediately without phasein period

## 2007 Accountability Ratings and AYP Status – By Campus Type

Campus Type	Total Campuses	Academically Unacceptable	Missed AYP
Elementary	4,290	3%	1%
Middle/Junior High	1,591	3%	12%
High School	1,704	5%	22%
Combined Grades	476	4%	8%
Total	8,061	3%	8%

## 2007 AYP – State Ratings Comparisons

#### Districts

- Of the 1,205 districts evaluated for AYP in 2007:
  - All districts rated Exemplary also Met AYP
  - 4 out of 214 districts (1.9%) rated Recognized did not Meet AYP
  - 110 out of the 912 districts (12.1%) rated
    Academically Acceptable did not Meet AYP

## 2007 AYP – State Ratings Comparisons

#### Campuses

- Of the 7,111 campuses evaluated for AYP in 2007:
  - 2 out of 616 campuses (0.3%) rated Exemplary did not Meet AYP
  - 14 out of 2,299 campuses (0.6%) rated Recognized did not Meet AYP
  - 513 out of the 3,927 campuses (13.1%) rated Academically Acceptable did not Meet AYP

## **Texas AYP History**

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#### 2003

Texas AYP Workbook approved by the US Department of Education.

- Texas AYP Workbook includes the application of the 1% federal cap.
- Texas approves a number of district appeals on the application of the federal cap and begins development of an agreement with the USDE in order to transition to USDE requirements.

- Texas does not submit any amendment requests and the Texas AYP workbook continues requirements through 2005.
- Texas and the USDE enter a Flexibility Agreement covering 2005, 2006, and 2007 that outlines required assessments developed for student with disabilities and the AYP calculations for inclusion of their results.

- Texas amends AYP workbook to include changes to AYP calculations based on 2005 flexibility agreement.
- Texas requests several amendments to the AYP Workbook, most of which are denied.
- Texas is approved for a flexibility waiver with the USDE on how to include students displaced by the 2005 Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in the 2006 AYP calculations.

- Texas AYP Workbook approved by the USDE includes:
  - Changes to AYP calculations due to 2005 flexibility agreement
  - Federal regulation requirements for limited English proficient students
  - Expiration of the flexibility waiver for students displaced by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

- Texas AYP Workbook submitted for approval on February 15, 2008 includes changes due to:
  - Expiration of the Flexibility Agreement on the inclusion of students with disabilities in the Texas AYP calculations.
  - Spring 2008 administration of new alternate assessments: TAKS-Alternate and TAKS-Modified
  - Resubmission of a 2006 amendment to the AYP Safe Harbor calculation.
