






Amachi Texas provides one-to-one mentors to children who have a family member in prison, on probation, or on parole.

5,504 Statewide Cumulative Matches



31% of Texas prisoners are functionally illiterate.	Since 2006, 96% of Amachi Texas children have been promoted to the next grade level. ⁶
70% of children of prisoners will follow their parents to prison. ³	Since 2006, less than 1% of Amachi Texas children have been referred to the criminal justice system. ⁶




