TEXAS PARKS AND WILDLIFE DEPARTMENT LAW ENFORCEMENT DIVISION HOMELAND SECURITY EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



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The following Homeland Security Executive Summary focuses on the homeland security funding received by Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) Law Enforcement, and its subsequent impact on the Division.

SUMMARY

By statute (ART. 2.12 Code of Criminal Procedure), game wardens commissioned by TPWD (SEC.11.019 Parks and Wildlife Code) are sworn Texas peace officers. The functional job description of game wardens remains focused on the traditional enforcement of game, fish, and water safety laws. However, events such as 9/11 and the influx of recent hurricanes plus the issues with the Mexican Border have impacted the peace officer duties of all Texas lawmen at the local, state, and national levels.

With support from the Governor's office and the Texas Legislature, TPWD has received homeland security funding for additional game wardens, law enforcement equipment, and operating funds. TPWD Law Enforcement Senior Management views this funding as a "winwin" situation between conservation enforcement efforts and our sworn duties as peace officers. The funding has not refocused our primary mission of the enforcement of game, fish and water safety laws. TPWD's priorities remain resource protection and public safety. TPWD's increased border presence also supports Texas as a "force multiplier," by providing enforcement assistance and intelligence to other law enforcement entities. For the record, the TPWD Law Enforcement Division does <u>not</u> enforce illegal immigration. This is a federal issue and enforcement is under the purview of the U.S. Border Patrol. TPWD game wardens arrest suspects (including illegal aliens) for violations of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code,

which includes the Texas Water Safety Act, and the Texas Penal Code. TPWD has <u>not</u> been asked or required to change our method of operation due to increased funding.
