Progress Report

The Texas Board of Architectural Examiners (TBAE) is pleased to submit this report of our progress in improving overall agency performance under the SDSI project.

- During public meetings in June and August, the nine-member Board proposed and adopted several new rules. Of particular note are new rules crafted to implement 2013 legislation. The Board addressed new legislative directives regarding the new fingerprint-based criminal history checks, fee structure, and test-passing requirement for Texas Registered Interior Designers.
- 2. The agency's outreach program held presentations or continuing education classes in Midland, Waco, and Dallas during the quarter, reaching a total of 263 stakeholders across four separate presentations.
- 3. In June, the agency welcomed two new Board Members and welcomed back one reappointed Member. Mr. Chuck Anastos, AIA of Corpus Christi was reappointed to the Board. Mr. Davey Edwards, TSPS of Decatur was appointed as a Public Member (replacing Mr. Brandon Pinson), and Mr. Chad Davis, ASLA of Lubbock was appointed as the Landscape Architect Member (replacing Ms. Diane Steinbrueck).
- 4. Agency staff and Board Members participated in the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards' annual meeting, the Building Officials Association of Texas annual conference, and the annual METROCON conference during the quarter.
