Year 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CIT Continues to be Assigned SIP Continues to be Implemented Campus Reconstitution* Plan Developed CIT Determines Educators to be Retained at Campus <p style="margin-left: 40px;">*RECONSTITUTION: 19 TAC §97.1051(7) defines reconstitution as the removal or reassignment of some or all campus administrative and/or instructional personnel in accordance with at least the minimum requirements of TEC, §39.1324(b), taking into consideration proactive measures the district or campus has taken regarding campus personnel; and the implementation of a campus redesign, approved by the commissioner of education, that provides a rigorous and relevant academic program; provides personal attention and guidance; promotes high expectations for all students; and addresses comprehensive school-wide improvements that cover all aspects of a school's operations, including, but not limited to, curriculum and instruction changes, structural and managerial innovations, sustained professional development, financial commitment, and enhanced involvement of parents and the community. Year 5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Closure** or Alternative Campus Management <u>Must</u> be Ordered Alternative Campus Management Order <u>May</u> be Waived for One Year [TEC §39.1327(c)] <p style="margin-left: 40px;">**CAMPUS CLOSURE AND REPURPOSING: Current rules at 19 TAC §97.1051(3) allow for the commissioner to approve the repurposing of a campus facility after an order of closure. A repurposed campus must house a completely different instructional program, bear a new name, and be assigned a new campus identification number. A repurposing plan shall not be approved unless all instructional activity under the programs operated at the repurposed building or facility occurs at grade levels not previously served by the closed campus; or at least 50% of the students previously served by the closed campus are reassigned to other campuses, the campus administrator is removed or reassigned to other campuses, and at least 75% of the instructional staff employed on the campus are removed or reassigned to other campuses.</p>
