Application Process:

Application packet consists of the following:

2. Professional Diagnosis of Autism, PDD-NOS, Mental Retardation, or Attention Deficit Disorder

For Ability to Pay:

2. DMR from Texana Center
3. Financial statement current within one year completed through Texana Center

Outreach Program:

*Short-term behavior analyst services to assess behavior, develop effective intervention strategies, and train care providers/educators in the implementation of the intervention strategies.

*Services provided typically in 1-2 hour treatment sessions two times a week at the BTTTC clinic. Treatment is typically concluded within 3-5 months.

*Services to school districts are by contract.

*In-home program consultation.

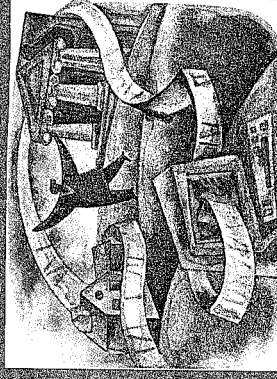

The BTTC is a well-established and respected service provider for the Houston area. The Texana BTTC Outreach Program has the staff expertise in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), an ongoing clinical practice, and a relationship with the local school districts to provide practical, thorough treatment directly to individuals and training to others in the skills of ABA.

The training is directed and supervised by Christie Enzina, M.A., Licensed Psychological Associate, Board Certified Behavior Analyst.

Ms. Enzina has established a well-respected career in the field of Behavior Analysis over the past 29 years in the Houston area.

All children and adults with and without developmental disabilities have the right to effective education and treatment based on the best available scientific evidence.

ABA is Applied Behavior Analysis:

Taking principles learned through research and using them to change behavior to a socially significant extent.

The U.S. Surgeon General's Report on Mental Health (1999) states that ABA is the only documented treatment intervention to be demonstrated through controlled research to increase communication, learning, and appropriate social behavior for individuals with autism.

ABA Treatment IS:

- *Individualized
- *Based on published, researched principles of behavior analysis
- *Supervised by a trained Behavior Analyst
- *Data based and driven
- *An active field of ongoing research

ABA Treatment is NOT:

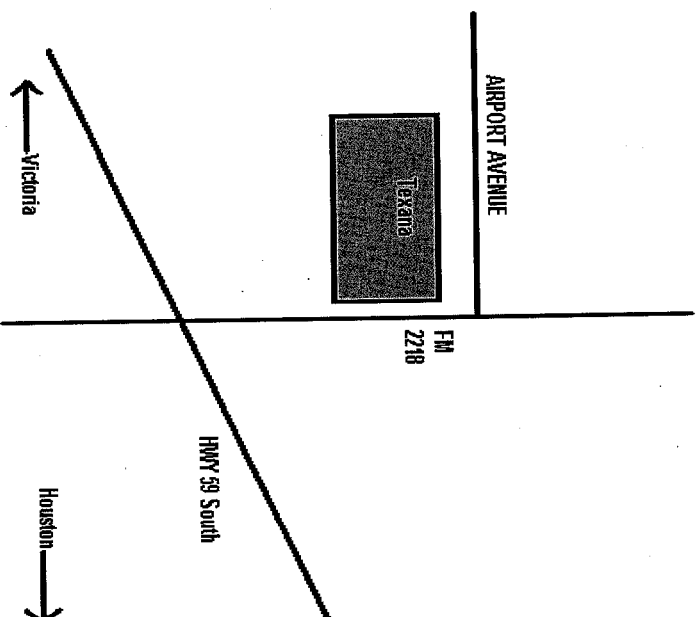
- *A specific teaching methodology
- *Always 1 on 1
- *Always discrete trial table top training
- *Dependent on giving candy for good behavior
- *Only used with individuals with autism
